I called there and spoke to Mrs. John Hounjet of this address. I was informed by her that they had just returned from a trip and that at noon today her husband had moved the car and had noticed an article in the snow, just in front of their car. They had not touched it and had called the Police. Her husband was not at home at this time but she showed me where this article was. The drive way is to the rear of the house and faces "orth. The article was next to the fence.

Description- A small brass top beleived from a lipstick tube. This article is presently stored in locker #D25.

A call was made at the City Hospital and a Mr. Nels Agren of 531 5th Ave. North, runs the C.N.I.B., lunch counter, was interviewed regarding this file.

He stated that he had a male person staying at his place, down the basement, who had been acting kind of funney of late. This persons name was a, Ove Jensen, formally of Vancouver (or so he thought) This person moved in on the 10th of January and was unemployed at this time. This man came in sometimes around 9:00 AM in the mornings and it was not known what time he had gone out, but definitely before. 7:00 AM when the informant got up. On the day of the murder all the boarders were asked, in a joking way where they had been, all had a answer but not the above mentioned. Then again on last night they w were having coffee together and the informant had mentioned the murder, then Jensen had sort of acted startled and put his head down on the table. I have been unable to check this person out at this time

A call was made to 1422 22nd Street West and a Audrey Odnokon was interviewed regading this file. She states that around December 22nd, and after she used to take a bus home from work at around 10:30PM and 11:00PM and get off this bus at 1400 Blk.20th St. She would wark North on Ave.O towards 22nd St. On a number(4) of occassions she had seen a man in the alley just behind 20th St., standing in about mid alley. He would start to come towards her and she always ran. On one occasion her boy friend was with her and this man came out of the alley and then walked past her going towards 20th Street. He had his collar or a scarf over part of his face. He kept looking back at them and finally went West on 20th Street. Thes man would be in his 40's and heavey set. He had broad shoulders, about 6 feet tall, grey hair and pearcing eyes, almost beadey.

She further stated that two of her girl friends had been talking and said that they had drove down the alley, rear of the furfera home on Friday night around 10:30 to 11:00PM. When they swung in the alley a male person was there and trying to hide something under his arm. This thing he was hiding had a glint to it like some piece of metal was on it. He had stepped into a yard near the T intersection. Girls names are- Barbara Best of 273 St Pauls Place and Linda Barron
