On March 5th, 1969 in company with Cp. RASMUSSEN of the RCMP, inquiries were conducted in the country for one Bertha BOUCHER, possibly a half breed and it was suggested that she knew the MILLER Family and also had come to the City on numerous occasions. At 10:50 AM we arrived in Delisle, Sask. and interviewed Wally POWERS, proprietor of Wally's Cafe in Delisle, who advised us that the girl in question who is employed by him was not at work that day but his information had gone to the Outlook Hospital in Outlook, Sask. because of the flue. We then proceeded to Outlook, Sask. arriving in Outlook at approx. 11:30 AM, inquiries were made by the RCMP Detachment in that location by S/Sgt. GREGORY at the Outlook Hospital, but upon checking their records they had no Bertha BOUCHER listed as a patient or received treatment at that Hospital. We then proceeded to Donavan Sask. and interviewed Bertha BOUCHER's grandmother who advised that this girl along with her parents had left on March 4th, for Russell, Man. and expected back sometime this week.

Upon arriving back in the City at approx. 1:45 PM we conducted inquiri for James BORISENKO and inquiries at XXXX 2015-17th St. West found no one home, but upon checking the mail this indicated that persons by the name of CRUISE resided at this address. Inquiries were also conducted at 2017-17th St. West which is the house just west of 2015 17th St. West, but the people at this residence stated that they have not heard or know of the James BORISENKO. Inquiries were then conducted at 1402 College Drive for further information pertaining to BORISENKO, but with negative results to date. We then proceeded to the Sutherla area and interviewed Ron HARDER who is the assistant manger of the Mohawk Service on Central Ave. He advises that he knows this James BORISENKO, but he does not know where this person now resides and he has not seen this person since September 1968.

At approx. 600 PM in company with Insp. RIDDELL and Cpl. RASMUSSEN of the RCMP we proceeded to 227 Ave. N South and interviewed Mr. and Mrs. Henry HUNJET and he advised that they were on holidays in Hawii from Jan. 19th returning on Feb. 2nd, 1969 and that their children wer ered for by Mr. and Mrs. Henry JENICK, 319 Ave. J South who resided at 227 Ave. N South while the HUNJET's were away on holidays to look aft $\epsilon$ their children. Mrs. JENICK is a sister to Mr. HUNJET. During the course of the interview Mrs. HUNJET states that she hasno knives missing from her residence and her 14 year old boy Danny HUNJET was also questioned and states that the fishing knife which was found, he is satisfied that is his property? and that last time he knows he had ever used it would be in July or September when digging a hole in this rear yard. Mr. and Mrs. HUNJET have had no prior problems with tresspassers re or prowlers or suspicious persons in the vicinity indicating that the area they live in has been very quiet and they have heard no information that would be of assistance in this regard.

At approx. 6:40 PM we interviewed Mrs. JENICK and her son Morris age 20 at 319 Ave. J South. The paring knife which was received from
