I am the assistant manager at Westwood Funeral Chapel located 1402-20 St. West, Saskatoon and I also reside at this address:

At approx. 5:30<sup>PM</sup> or 5:35<sup>PM</sup> on January 31, 1969, I was informed by Rae Murchuck that apparently a woman was lying in the lane and if I would go with him.

I put my coat on and went with M<sup>r</sup> Rae Murchuck - in the lane I saw a girl who pointed out the body to me. I in the lane which runs north & south in the 2nd block Avenue N. South I observed a woman lying face down in the snow. I kinda tugged at the woman's shoulder and also spoke to her - I turned her over a bit - but then I saw that she was dead. The snow around the body appeared to have been moved up and there was a spot of blood near her in the snow.
