Mr. William Campbell states as follows:

I operate the Belmont Texas Service Station located at 22 St. W & Ave. W. Inside at 1120 - Ave. Y. No - phone 382-3920.

On January 31<sup>st</sup>, 1969, between approx. 9<sup>am</sup> & 9<sup>30</sup> - I attended a service call to the south lane in the 100 BKK - Ave. T South - This lane runs north & south between 100 BKKs - Ave S & T. South.

When I attended I noticed two cars in this lane - a 1963 - Ford Galaxie 500 Red color - Lic unknown. The other car was parked to the north of the first auto. This second auto was 1958 Pontiac with a grey hood. There were three young fellows in this car at this time.

The operator of the 1963 Ford - was the person who had phoned for a tow. I pulled this auto out of the lane. As soon as I embarked from this tow job - one of the fellows from the 1958 Pontiac - came to me - and asked me how much for a boost.

The three fellows in this auto with the grey hood I only saw the one person & I would describe him as 19-20 yrs - dark hair & complexion - I cannot give any desc. of his clothing & I would not know this person to see again.

The reason I reported this is that I wondered where this person got the money so fast, & ~~was~~ if they were Regina boys - what they were doing in this alley. When I spoke to this person he appeared to be excited or may have been cold.
