On Feb. 2, 1969, at 12:00 noon I received a witness statement from William Alexander CAMPBELL, who resides at 1120 Ave. Y. NO., and operates the Service Station Belmount Texaco Service at 22nd St. and Ave. W. In his statement Mr. CAMPBELL advises that on Jan. 31, 1969, between 9:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. he had a service call to the south lane in the 100 block Ave. T. So. This lane runs north and south between the 100 blocks Ave. S. and Ave. T. When he attended two cars were in this lane, a 1963 Ford Galaxie 500, red colour, lic. unknown, and the other car was parked to the north of this first auto, and the second car was a 1958 Pontiac, with a grey hood. There were three young fellows in this car at the time. Appearently the operator of this 1963 Ford was the person who had requested a tow truck to this area and Mr. CAMPBELL advises that after pulling this 1963 Ford out of the lane and unhooked, one of the fellows in the 1953 Pontiac came to him and asked him what it would cost for a boost. CAMPBELL advised him and this youth apparently told him that he did not have any money and that he was from Pegina. Mr. CAMPBELL states that the lic. for this 1958 Pontiac was 304865. Mr. CAMPBELL advises that he then returned to his service station and then approx. 15 minutes later this young fellow who had spoke to him out on Ave. G. regarding a boost returned to the garage and told him that he had the money to pay. At this time Mr. CAMPBELL sent his attendant or employee Garry McQUHEY of 1120 Ave. Y. N with a tow truck to this area to give this person a boost. Mr. CAMPBELL advises when McQUHEY returned to this service station 15 min. later, McQUHEY advised that this person with the grey hooded auto was given a boost and it was not paid at the time but apparently this young fellow only only had a \$10.00 bill with him and would call at the service station and pay it which they apparently have not to date. Mr. CAMPBELL advised that of the three yourg fellows in this car, he only saw one of them, and he described him at 19 - 20 years, dark hair, and complexion and he had not described his clothing and he would not know the person to see again. Reason Mr. CAMPBELL reported this to our department is that he wondered where the person had got the money so fast and they were from Regina, what were they doing in the alley. Lic. #304865, we have no listing for at the present time but should this lic. should be sent to Regina and obtain the listing.

At 4:20 p.m., FEb. 2, 1969, I accompanied Sgt. MACKIE and Sgt. OLEKSYN, to 130 Ave. 0. So., to recheck the room of Gail MILLER located on the second floor.

At approx. 4:40 p.m. on going to the garbage pail located unter the sink in the room, I located one unfinished and unsigned letter, dated Jan. 22, 1969, 1:00 p.m., heading "Hi Wendy"

At 4:50 p.m. I located one letter under the bed located in this room. This letter was not dated and had the # heading "Dear Les", signed, best regards. Gail.

On Feb 2 I received a telephone call at my residence from Raymond MORIN well known to this department. At this time MORIN wished to advise me of a woman by the name of Darlene BARRY address F16-18 Bateman Cres. was alkeged to have been indecently assaulted approximately a week ago.

It might be noted that BARRY is also well known to this department particularly by members of the Morality section. According to MORIN Miss BARRY was coming out of a confectionary store name unknown but it is located somewhere near where she resides. It was suggested to MORIN that BARRY should have reported this. However MORIN stated that in view of the record BARRY has she doubted that any member of this department would believe her story.

MORIN did suggest that he prefered a member of the detective's department interview her in preference to the Morality section. He further stated if there was difficulty witnessed there that perhaps I could get in touch with MORIN and advise him. At this point he then suggested he would be more than willing to assist.
