At 3 a.m. this date I spoke to Sid SARGENT, 1502 Warman Rd., who was working late in his place of business at the Shell office, 500 blk. At N South. His home phone no. 652-7630 and his business phone, 244-812/ Sargent states that on the morning of the murder he had left the Shell office at exactly 7 a.m. and driven a truck north on Ave. N. to 20th St. where he had come to a stop. Sargent states the time would be between 7 a.m. and 7:05 a.m. when he arrived at 20th St. He observed a woman standing at the bus stop at the south curb wearing a blue or what appeared to be a blue coat similar to a nurse's cape. This woman also wore white mylons, a white dress, and may have been wearing ahat. Before proceeding from the stop sign Sargent states he saw a young mal person, age 18-20 years, staggering in a southerly direction on Ave. N towards 20th St. He described the person as approx. 6'2", skinny, blondish hair. He wore blue jeans and a kacki coat. The youth was staggering as though drunk however may have been walking in this manne if he had been wearing leather shoes. Sid-Sargent did not pay any mor attention to the 2 persons and then drove away. He deayed contacting the Police on this matter as he belived the information was of little importance. Perhpas photos could be shown to Sargent and identificati made.
